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RULES & BY LAWS

1. Boll Weevil Livestock and Rodeo hereinafter referred to as BWL.
2. BWL will have a director for all events beginning January 1, 2025 as listed below:

President – Bob Kasper

Vice-President/Treasurer – Tina Kasper

Administrative Secretary – Haven Miner

Barrels & Poles Director – Kayla Kasper

Goat Tying Director – Lexie Kasper

Rough Stock Director – Frank Kasper

Roping Director – Travis Miner
3. BWL Directors will have monthly meetings; in person or via phone and minutes will be maintained by Tina Kasper.
4. Treasurer, Tina Kasper, will provide at such meetings, the current status of Income and Expenses based on membership funds and sponsorship monies. This report would be available upon request by members.
5. BWL Rules and By Laws will be maintained by the Directors listed. Any questions or concerns may be directed to these Directors regarding these Rules & By Laws.
6. The BWL Directors reserve the right to make amendments to rule book where necessary to benefit members of BWL. The amendment(s) will be available to all members.

MEETINGS

1. Meetings will be held monthly for Directors.
2. Directors all have a vote. Majority rules.
3. Members may attend a meeting upon request and approval by the Directors.
4. General Membership Meeting will be held at Finals.

MEMBERSHIP & DUES

1. Dues shall be set by the Directors and reviewed with the Members each year.
2. Membership fees will be \$50.00 for 19 and under and \$60.00 for 20 and over.
3. Points will be awarded after membership has been paid.
4. Directors reserve the right to refuse or revoke membership at any time.

5. Membership Applications include a release of liability of BWL, Directors, Staff and other members. Signing the membership application releases BWL and all acquaintances of medical or financial liability to said member during a rodeo or rodeo activities.
6. Event classes are as follows; 6 and under, 9 & under, 14 & under, 19 & under and Open. The directors reserve the right to add an Adult and Over 40 or Over 50 classes if deemed necessary.

GENERAL RULES

All Contestants shall observe the general rules set by the Directors as printed in the Rulebook. Disclaimer: The Directors recognizes that situations may arise, not discussed in this rulebook, and reserve the right to make decisions in the best interest of BWL and the members.

1. A contestant must be a paid member to earn points and go to finals.
2. There will be no limit to the number of BWL sanctioned events per weekend as sanctioned by the Directors.
3. Exhibition will be allowed at each rodeo and Directors will make decision on when exhibition runs will be made based on said rodeo. There are no exhibitions at finals.
4. Any issue that may arise during a rodeo, contestant must seek director of the event to discuss. The director will take discussion to the judge, who will have the final say at the rodeo.
5. Money Payouts to Contestants as follows:

6. Fees to be distributed as follows:

- A. Ground money will put into Finals Fund in that event. If no contestant wins event, all ground money will be split equally between contestants in the event at finals.
 - B. Awards fund is money put aside for year end and finals awards. Awards will be purchased and distributed based on funds available.
 - C. BWL Fees pays the judges, staff and stock.
6. Non-members will be charged \$10 per rodeo paid to BWL.
 7. Age divisions are as of January 1st of the year.
 - a. Bottom age numbers are not “capped” to that age group. Example: A 14 year old barrel racing contestant may enter in the 14 and under, 19 and under and open age division.
 8. ALL AROUND POINTS will be awarded to a boy and girl in each age division. Contestants competing in 2 or more events will qualify. Awards will be based on available funds after finals. There must be 2 or more members in an age class to be considered an All Around Division.
 9. A waiver must be signed upon becoming a member by an adult 18 years or older for all youth and open classes as well as non-members must sign waiver to compete.
 10. Contestants may enter in any age class that they qualify for and will receive points for each class.
 11. Performance Rodeos will require dress code as follows: hat, boots and long sleeve button down shirts. Please follow those rules. Anyone competing without being in dress code will receive a penalty assigned by the judge.
 12. Protective gear including helmet and vest is required to compete in rough stock events if contestant is under 18 years of age.
 13. Judges and staff will not permit any type of harassment from contestants whether member or non-member or guardians thereof. Any issues, concerns or discrepancies must be politely discussed with the judge or the director of said event during that rodeo.

Fines and/or penalties can and will be assessed by the judges or directors including time penalties, score penalties or fines up to \$100 per incident not to exclude disqualifications or membership revocation. Please be kind!
 14. The Point System is as follows:
 - 10 pts for 1st place
 - 9 pts for 2nd place

8 pts for 3rd place

7 pts for 4th place

6 pts for 5th place

5 pts for 6th place

4 pts for 7th place

3 pts for 8th place

2 pts for 9th place

1 pt for 10th place and for all members who participated but did not place in top nine.

*The member's event position points will remain the same even if non-members place within the top ten, member's points will not be moved up.

15. Rough stock will have a draw. Breakaway, Steer Breakaway, Calf and Ribbon Roping will have a draw. Goats and Team Roping will be chute run.
16. Finals Rodeo and Event Rules will be set by the Directors and presented to the members prior to Finals.
17. If BWL receives a bad check, contestant will be required to pay in cash the amount of check plus \$20 fee and will not be allowed to compete until amount has been paid.
18. If you called in for rodeo or a friend called you in and you have not contacted BWL to draw out, you will need to pay the entry fee in total to BWL.
19. Rough stock events will have 2 judges, one will carry a stopwatch and record official rider times on sheet for qualification and observation.
20. Any non-movable obstacle cannot foul contestant.
21. Judges must complete a diagram showing arena and stakes for each club.
22. Judges may inspect contestant's equipment before, during or after performance for safety or rule infractions.
23. No alcohol or fireworks are allowed at rodeos.
24. Rainout/Storm Rule: In the event of rainout/storm, the judges and/or directors can decide to suspend or cancel a rodeo. A re-schedule will be determined and announced at a later date.

GENERAL ROUGH STOCK RULES

1. All riders must be on both judge sheets to compete or exhibition.
2. Required protective gear must be worn if under the age of 18.
3. Open and Junior class must declare if fouled immediately in order to qualify for re-ride. Other age classes, the judges will decide.
4. Other re-ride options; animal fails to get out of chute after 2 attempts, rider is fouled, stock falls, stock stops or hesitates for more than ½ the ride
5. Re-rides do not happen if rider equipment breaks or comes untied.
6. All re-ride bulls will follow original draws.
7. All bulls will be tipped to size of quarter.
8. Flank ropes will be the same.

BARREL RACING

(6U BOYS & GIRLS, 9U BOYS & GIRLS, 14U BOYS & GIRLS, 19U BOYS & GIRLS, OPEN: ALL AGES)

1. Time will begin when the horse's nose crosses timer and in parent assist when the horse's nose crosses the timer and time will stop in the same format.
2. Barrels will be placed at a minimum of 15 feet from fence or bucking chutes and third barrel no more than 20 feet more than the distance between first and second barrels providing the space is available in the arena.
3. Score line should be a minimum of 40 feet.
4. Barrels are placed in a cloverleaf pattern.
5. Electronic timers must be used and backup times recorded.
6. If contestant crosses timer line during run, time is stopped and run is disqualified.
7. If contestant knocks a barrel, a 5 second penalty is added to time for each knocked barrel.
8. Arena must be drug or raked after 15 runs.
9. Barrel times may be rolled from any age class to open but must be paid and declared before the barrel racing event starts.
10. Open barrel racers may enter a second (different) horse in only the open class and must be paid before the barrel racing event starts.
 - a. Year End and All Around points (if applicable) will be taken from best run only.

POLE BENDING

(6U BOYS & GIRLS, 9U BOYS & GIRLS, 14U BOYS & GIRLS, 19U BOYS & GIRLS, OPEN: ALL AGES)

1. Time will begin when the horse's nose crosses timer and in parent assist when the horse's nose crosses the time and time will stop in the same format.
2. Pole pattern is 6 poles placed 21 feet apart in a straight line down the arena. The first pole should be 21 feet from the starting line if possible. Score line should be a minimum of 40 feet.
3. Electronic timers must be used and backup times recorded.

4. If contestant crosses timer line during run, time is stopped and run is disqualified.
5. If contestant knocks a pole, a 5 second penalty is added to time for each knocked pole.
6. Arena must be drug or raked after 15 runs.
7. Pole times may be rolled from any age class to open but must be paid and declared before pole bending event starts.
8. Open Pole Benders may enter a second (different) horse in only the open class and must be paid before the pole bending event starts.
 - a. Year End and All Around points (if applicable) will be taken from best run only.

BARRELS & POLES ASSISTED

(6 & UNDER BOYS & GIRLS)

1. Contestant can be assisted by someone to run in with the rider and horse. If assisted, timer will start when assistant or horse's nose passes timer and stop when assistant or horse's nose passes timer.
2. The rider may have an assistant or compete without assistance.
 - a. If you start with assistance and the timer starts, you must finish with assistance to then stop the timer.
3. All other rules apply as listed above in "Barrel Racing" and "Pole Bending."
4. Lead rope must not exceed 8 feet in length.

BREAKAWAY ROPING

(9U BOYS & GIRLS, 14U BOYS & GIRLS, 19U BOYS & GIRLS, OPEN: ALL AGES)

1. The contestant shall ride from behind the barrier (unless 9 and under, barrier not required). A ten second penalty imposed on breaking the barrier.
2. If barrier equipment fouls the horse, rider or equipment, the contestant must declare and immediately pull up and not run the stock in order to get a re-ride. 9 and under contestants declaration is not required and judge can decide.
3. Any obstacles outside the roping box causing a foul will not constitute a re-ride option.
4. The horse must break the plane of roping box before roper may rope.
5. The score line will be 6 feet to 10 feet at the discretion of the judge. Two Hazers are allowed and encouraged to keep stock running straight. Hazers must not physically touch the stock.

6. If the calf escapes the arena, the flagman will stop time. The roper will begin in the roping box, lap and tap, with the same animal, adding the first and second time together.
7. Calves should be tied down and ran prior to performance.
8. Calves horns should not exceed 2 inches in length.
9. Rope should be tied with provided breakaway string to saddle horn and checked by judge. Rope should include a flag for easy visibility.
10. Roper's rope should go over the nose and breakaway from the saddle horn to be considered a qualified catch.
11. 30 second time limit for all classes but 14 and under.
12. Catch pen gate will remain open.
13. The roping box will be considered part of the arena.
14. Roper will be allowed one loop at a rodeo. At finals, contestants are allowed two loops. No building or rebuilding a loop is allowed at finals.
15. Any open breakaway contestant may enter a second time for the money.
 - b. Year End and All Around points (if applicable) will be taken from best run only.

STEER BREAKAWAY ROPING

(9U BOYS & GIRLS, 14U BOYS & GIRLS)

1. The contestant shall ride from behind the barrier (unless 9 and under, barrier not required). A ten second penalty imposed on breaking the barrier.
2. If barrier equipment fouls the horse, rider or equipment, the contestant must declare and immediately pull up and not run the stock in order to get a re-ride. 9 and under contestants declaration is not required and judge can decide.
3. Rope should be tied with provided breakaway string to saddle horn and checked by judge. Rope should include a flag for easy visibility.
4. Any obstacles outside the roping box causing a foul will not constitute a re-ride option.
5. The horse must break the plane of roping box before roper may rope.
6. Roper will come from the heading box.
7. There are only 3 legal catches: Head & both horns, half of a head, or around the neck. Any other catch is considered illegal. A front leg catch is illegal. The flag judge will

signal for time to stop when the rope breaks from saddle horn by motion of steer or horse.

8. The contestant receives a no time if they break the rope away from the horn by hand. If the rope should dally around the horn, the contestant may ride forward, undally the rope, then stop the horse to make the rope break away from the horn.
9. If the steer escapes the arena, the flagman will stop time. The roper will begin in the roping box, lap and tap, with the same animal, adding the first and second time together.
10. The score line will be 6 feet to 10 feet at the discretion of the judge. One hazer will be allowed on horseback to come out of the heeling box side.
11. If the steer breaks the plane of the out gate or time has elapsed before string breaks, contestant receives a no time.
12. The roping box will be considered part of the arena.
13. Catch pen gate will remain open.
14. Roper will be allowed one loop at a rodeo. At finals, contestants are allowed two loops. No building or rebuilding a loop is allowed at finals.

CALF ROPING

(19U BOYS & GIRLS, OPEN: ALL AGES)

1. Roper shall ride from behind the barrier. A ten second penalty imposed for breaking the barrier.
2. If roper or horse is fouled by barrier or equipment, he must declare and immediately pull up in order to receive a re-ride.
3. Any fouls outside the roping box will not be considered for a re-ride option.
4. The horse must cross the barrier before roper can rope the calf.
5. If the calf escapes the arena, the flagman will stop time and will run a lap and tap.
6. Calf roping is considered a catch as can. Roper must throw a rope that has been tied to the saddle, catch the calf, dismount, go down the rope, throw the calf by hand (must be day-lighted and three feet must've been lifted off the ground, tie 3 legs of the calf and lift hands in the air declaring time to be called. Time is taken. Rider remounts horse, loosens slack from the calf and the 6 second required for calf to be tied is taken. If calf comes untied before 6 seconds it is considered a no-time.
7. Any open calf roper may enter a second time for the money. Points will be taken on the best time.

8. Catch pen gate will remain open.
9. There will be a 60 second time limit.
10. Roper will be allowed one loop at a rodeo. At finals, contestants are allowed two loops.
No building or rebuilding a loop is allowed at finals.

RIBBON ROPING

(OPEN TO ALL AGES)

1. Roper shall ride from behind the barrier. A ten second penalty imposed for breaking the barrier.
2. Roper must rope calf, dismount and have a hand on the calf when the runner takes the ribbon off the calf's tail. Any piece of the ribbon is legal. Runner must run back across finish line. If ribbon falls off calf before runner reaches calf, runner is to touch the calf on hip and run across finish line. Line Judge will drop flag once across finish line and time stops.
3. If roper or horse is fouled by barrier or equipment, he must declare and immediately pull up in order to receive a re-ride.
4. Any fouls outside the roping box will not be considered for a re-ride option.
5. The horse must cross the barrier before roper can rope the calf.
6. If the calf escapes the arena, the flagman will stop time and will run a lap and tap.
7. Calf roping is considered a catch as can. Roper must throw a rope that has been tied to the saddle, catch the calf, dismount, go down the rope and touch the calf. The runner then must grab the ribbon from the tail and run back to flag line. Flagger judge will flag when runner passes by and timer stops.
8. Roper and runner may enter 2 times with a different team and points will be taken for both runs.
9. There will be one loop allowed including at finals.
10. Catch pen gate will remain open.
11. There will be a 60 second time limit.

TEAM ROPING

(OPEN TO ALL AGES)

1. The contestant, header or heeler, may enter 4 times by changing ends or partners.
Each roper may enter for the draw. The draw, however, does not allow points for drawn

partner. The roper that was drawn will qualify for full payout of earned position less entry fee and \$10 (awards fee).

2. The header will start behind the barrier from the left side of the chute. A 10 second penalty will be added to final time for breaking the barrier. The steer belongs to the team after it crosses the score line or breaks the barrier regardless of what happens with three exceptions:
 - a. If the steer gets out of the arena, the flag will be dropped and the ropers get the steer back, lap and tap, with the time added to the first time. The team will only be allowed the remaining unused loops. No barrier will be used on lap and tap. The judge will signal time to start when the animal's head clears the gate.
 - b. Mechanical failure
 - c. Catch pen gate opens prematurely.
3. Each roper will be allowed to carry only one rope. Any heeler 50 or older and all girls may use a quick release device in the open class. No ropes will be allowed to be tied on hard & fast. Under no circumstance will any header be permitted to tie on.
4. If a roper is fouled by a non-movable obstacle in the arena, a re-run will not be given.
5. If the barrier is broken at any place other than the designated place, the barrier will not be considered broken. The barrier will not be considered broken unless the ring falls within ten feet of the post.
6. If the barrier equipment fouls the horse, rider or equipment the team must declare themselves by immediately pulling up. The team will receive a re-run.
7. The roping box will be closed on both sides at an average rodeo, including finals if applicable. Judges will decide if not available prior to start of rodeo and roping boxes only will be considered part of the arena.
8. A steer must change direction before heeler can rope.
9. Time will be taken when the steer is stopped, both horses front feet are on the ground and facing the steer with ropes dallied and tight. The steer must be standing up when roped by the head or heels. A broken rope or missed dally or team is not facing will be considered a no time. A qualified catch is either a both horn catch, half head catch or neck catch for header and a 2 leg catch or single leg catch by heeler. A 5 sec penalty will be added to time for single leg heel catch. A front leg catch is illegal and disqualifies the team.
10. The steer must not be handled rough nor beat, whipped, kicked or run over by roper's horse at any time and judge has the option to disqualify the team.

11. There will be a 60 second time limit and catch pen will be closed.
12. Ropers are required to go directly into the roping box when steer is loaded.
13. Steers must have horn wraps.

TEAM ROPING – MIXED

(AGES AS LISTED IN RULE #1)

1. Mixed team roping will allow 2 runs with different teams as follows;
 - Youth 15 & under & youth 15 & under
 - Open & youth 15 & under
 - Female & female
 - Female & male
2. Mixed Team Roping will allow only 2 runs and runs can be drawn but must align as listed above.
3. Other Team Roping rules apply as listed in Team Roping.

CHUTE DOGGING

(19U BOYS & GIRLS, OPEN: ALL AGES)

1. The gate (bucking chutes) should be open for **chute dogging** to 90 degrees, at that point, chalk a line parallel to the bucking chute with the end of the open chute gate.
2. The steer loaded in the chutes, the dogger gets beside the steer, places his/her hand on the horn, right hand behind the right front shoulder. When the dogger is ready, the chute gate will be opened. The dogger must keep his right hand behind the steer's shoulder until any part of the steer crosses the white chalk line. At this point, time starts, and the dogger can move his/her right hand to the horn and throw the steer. There will be a thirty second time limit. If the contestant goes to the horn before the line, a 10 second penalty will be assessed. If contestant throws the steer before the start line, this will result in a no time.
3. Deviation in rules will constitute disqualification. The judge will decide this.
4. There will be 2 judges, one line judge to start time and enforce the arm rule and one flag judge to stop the time.
5. No steer tailing.
6. Only contestant allowed in the chute.

7. The dogger must stop or switch the steer's direction and twist the steer down. If steer gets loose the contestant will be disqualified.
8. Steers will be 600 pounds or less. No horn wraps.
9. The steer is considered down when it is lying flat on its side with all 4 feet straight and the head turned back to steers hip and on the same side. The contestant must have one hand on the steer when flagged.

STEER WRESTLING

(19U BOYS & GIRLS, OPEN: ALL AGES)

1. **Steer Wrestling**, the steer is caught from a horse from the roping box. Contestant is allowed a hazer rider/horse and must interfere with contestant. The contestant must bring steer to a stop and/or change direction and twist it down. If the steer is accidentally knocked down or thrown down before being brought to a stop or if thrown by wrestler putting the steers horse into the ground, the steer must be let up and all 4 feet and then twisted down. The steer will be considered down when it is lying flat on its side with all 4 feet straight and the head turned back to steers hip and on the same side. The contestant must have one hand on the steer when flagged.
2. There is a 60 second time limit.
3. Time is to be taken between 2 flags. Ten second penalty will be added to the time for breaking the barrier.
4. If the barrier equipment fouls the horse, rider or equipment, contestant must declare immediately for a re-ride option.
5. The contestant must go directly to the roping, as well as hazer when the steer is ready.

GOAT TYING

(9U BOYS & GIRLS, 14U BOYS & GIRLS, 19U BOYS & GIRLS, OPEN: WOMEN OF ALL AGES)

1. The goats will be uniform in size for each age division.
2. The goat will be staked at the end of a ten foot tether at a permanent location as marked for the entire rodeo.
3. The stake shall be level with the surface of the ground, 105 feet from start line of the fifth pole bending pole.
4. The goat should be held by the collar in a vertical position behind the stake until the time starts. Contestants cross the starting line, ride toward the goat, dismount, throw the goat and cross and tie 3 feet of goat. Contestant will be penalized 10 seconds if horse hits the rope or the goat. If the goat should break away from stake or rope, contestant will do

a lap and tap. If the goat breaks away due to a horse stepping on rope or goat, the contestant will receive a no time.

5. Contestant is still mounted until both feet have hit the ground.
6. A piggin' string or goat rope must be used to tie goat.
7. Time starts when contestant passes flagger in arena and when contestant has tied the goat, he/she must throw hands in the air to stop time. The contestant must step away from goat and judge will start timer, goat must remain tied for 5 seconds to receive a qualified time.
8. Contestant may be assessed a penalty of 5 seconds due to unnecessary roughness by judge.
9. Goats may be used for only 3 consecutive runs.

GOAT UNTYING

(6 & UNDER BOYS & GIRLS)

1. Contestant enters arena with an assisted runner. The tethered goat will have ribbon tied to tail. The runner brings contestant to goat and assist in dismounting as needed. The contestant will grab the ribbon and cross the rope that is 10 feet from goat tether.
 - a. If the ribbon falls off the goat's tail before the contestant runs to the goat, the contestant must pick the ribbon up off the ground and run across the rope to then stop the timer.
2. The time will start when the assistant or horse's nose crosses start line of flagger judge and end with the contestant crossing the rope line.
3. The rider may have an assistant or compete without assistance.
 - a. If you start with assistance and the timer starts, you must finish with assistance to then stop the timer.
4. Contestant will be penalized 10 seconds if horse hits the rope or the goat.
5. Lead rope must not exceed 8 feet in length.

FINALS & AWARDS

Finals packets will be distributed with general information and fees in August to include award and jacket information. Fees should be 3x your event entry fee. You must be a member to be eligible for finals. There will be a sponsorship fee collected of \$50 per event with a maximum of \$150 per contestant. The due date for sponsorship money is TBA. Example: If a contestant is going to finals in bull riding, you will only owe a \$50 sponsorship fee. If contestant is going to finals in barrel racing, pole bending, goat tying and breakaway roping, you will only owe \$150 in sponsorship fees, not \$200. 2025 Finals will be held at Double J Arena in Humansville, MO.
